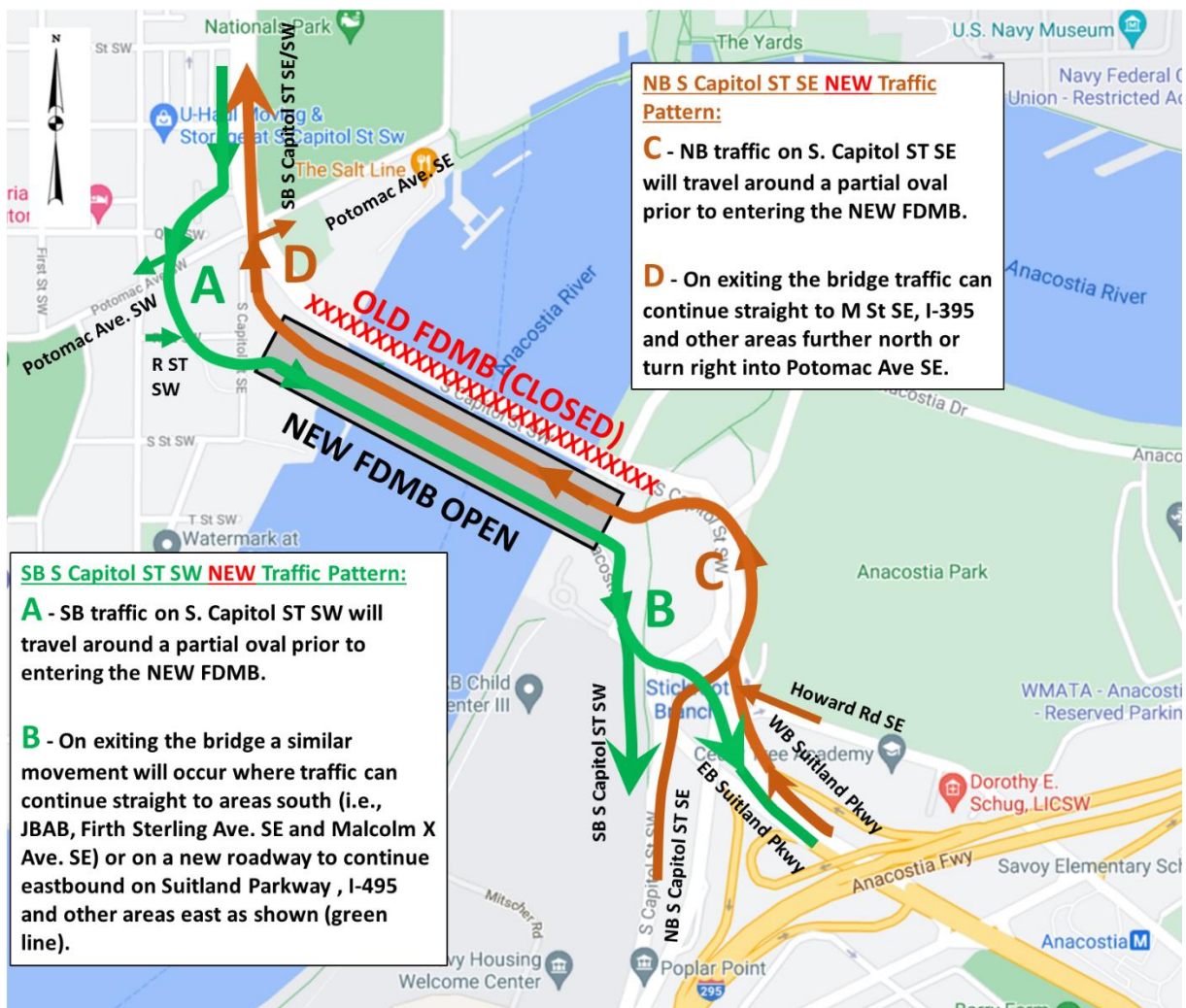
Opening of the New Frederick Douglass Memorial Bridge September 7-9, 2021

(Washington, DC) - The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will open the New Frederick Douglass Memorial Bridge to traffic on South Capitol Street SE/SW. On Wednesday, September 8, Southbound traffic on South Capitol Street will be shifted onto the new bridge, while Northbound traffic on South Capitol Street will be temporarily shifted to the old southbound lanes on the old bridge. On Thursday, September 9, Northbound traffic on South Capitol Street will be shifted onto the new bridge. Temporary lane closures will be in place starting Tuesday night, September 7, extending through Wednesday night, September 8. These dates are subject to change in case of inclement weather.

Pedestrians and bicyclists are advised that only the sidewalk on the west side of the new bridge will be open at this time, providing access to both sides of the Anacostia River. The sidewalk on the east side of the new bridge will open at a later date.

Marked detours will be in place during these closures. Please observe the posted speed limit and proceed through the construction area with caution. Pedestrians and cyclists are advised to stay alert and follow signage when traveling through this area. These closures are necessary for construction activities associated with the South Capitol Street Corridor Project which includes construction of the New Frederick Douglass Memorial Bridge and the reconstruction of the I-295/ Suitland Parkway interchange.
