I-295 Full Closures (30-Minute Periods) March 30 through April 2, 2020

(Washington, DC)—The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will temporarily close lanes and shoulders, including full roadway closures, on the following roads to perform overhead sign structure removal.

I-295 Northbound/Southbound

Periodic 30-minute full roadway closures between Howard Road, SE and I-695 to I-395
Downtown, nightly from 12:00 midnight to 4:00 am, Monday, March 30, 2020 through
the morning of Friday, April 3, 2020, weather permitting.

The following road, lane and shoulder closures will also be in place nightly from 9:00 pm to 5:00 am, Monday, March 30, 2020 through the morning of Friday, April 3, 2020, weather permitting.

- I-295 northbound up to two left or right lanes between Howard Road, SE and I-695 to I-395 Downtown (Exit 5A)
- I-295 southbound up to two left or right lanes between I-695 (Exits 1B-C) and Howard Road, SE (Exit 4B)

Motorists are urged to use caution as they travel in these areas, expect slow moving traffic and delays, and to be mindful of construction personnel.

These closures are necessary for construction activities associated with the South Capitol Street Corridor Project which includes construction of the New Frederick Douglass Memorial Bridge and the reconstruction of the I-295/Suitland Parkway interchange.
